Wesley UMC family,

Today is the last day of the month of January, and it certainly has been filled with some unexpected surprises. Our Food Pantry, even though it was only open for 3 out of the 5 Tuesdays due to the holidays and icy weather, served 84 households in our community. While it wasn't safe to venture out on the roads and sidewalks, we continued with worship through Facebook from the comfort of our homes and regular surroundings. Though everything didn't happen like we expected, I see God at work in and through the ministries of our congregation.

Debbie and I have been working on our annual statistical reports that are submitted to the Conference offices. It's a helpful way to take note of some of the changes from year to year in terms of membership, ministry, and finances. I look forward to sharing more with you about those insights. Whenever there is a dramatic change in a category, a box pops up for you to give an explanation. When I came to the category for on-going classes and other small groups (all ages) other than Sunday Church School, I added one to our number since this past year we began our Love Tupelo group for young adults in partnership with St. Luke. When the box popped up, I was able to explain and share about our new joint ministry. In terms of our membership after accounting for those who have died, transferred their membership, or joined Wesley through confirmation, we ended up with a net increase of one, which is also a 1% increase. While I am hopeful that we can improve that number in the years moving forward, I celebrate that we are in the positive. We have areas where we have been able to reduce some operating expenses and increase our generosity to United Methodist and other charitable causes, including our United Methodist Men and Sunday Fund Offering. Our average weekly in-person worship attendance and Sunday School attendance has continued to increase. Though the focus isn't on the numbers, I think the metrics help us pay attention to the trends and lean into where the Spirit is leading us.

This Sunday, we will continue with Mark 5 with some other stories of healing. The three people that Jesus heals in Mark 5 are each very different: the Gerasene demoniac, the woman who had been hemorrhaging for 12 long years; and the 12-year old daughter of Jairus, a leader of the synagogue. We see people of different ages, backgrounds, social statuses, genders, and situations. Yet, these stories are stacked together in a way that we see Jesus as the common denominator. I wonder what it would look like to put these three in a room together. What if we could hear each one tell their story and witness to the power and healing of God?

Of course, that's what we experience in community on any given Wednesday night or Sunday morning. People of different ages, backgrounds, views of the world, social statuses, genders, and situations come forward to the communion table with our hands outstretched seeking God's presence and healing. We study Scripture and serve alongside each other. Do we focus on the differences, or do we realize that what we have in common through Christ is far greater? I pray that the salvation, healing, love, and grace we experience from Jesus bind us together in ways that transcend our differences. I love that Jesus says to woman who touched him, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." May we find peace and healing through our faith and trust in God and as we come together as a powerful witness to Christ.




